The global theme, My MS Diagnosis, provided a powerful opportunity to start conversations and break down barriers among Clients, staff, and the broader WA community. 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Jo Penkin: One step at a time

Looking back, Jo recognises she was never one to shy away from a challenge. Diagnosed with MS in her early twenties, she was simply too busy to acknowledge her symptoms and instead turned her attention to something experienced by only 1% of the population - marathon running. Jo has incredibly completed 20 marathons across the globe, driven by a simple mindset – when things get tough, one step at a time and one foot in front of the other.

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Sophie's mission

In 2024, Sophie was living what many would call a dream life - healthy, active, and surrounded by loved ones. But a week after her 27th birthday, a sudden diagnosis of MS turned everything upside down. One year on, Sophie is sharing her story of resilience, mindset, and the power of support, that she has received from MSWA and the After Hours program. "I want other people to know that a diagnosis doesn't mean your life is over - far from it."

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Running Beyond Limits

This August, a group of mates from a local running club in Perth are taking on their biggest challenge yet - running over 400 kilometres from Osborne Park to Bluff Knoll in just five days to raise money and awareness for multiple sclerosis. The event called Beyond Limits: 400km for MS, is not just about distance; it's deeply personal.

Days before school started, Cathy had what she thought was a nasty migraine. Instead, she was diagnosed with MS.

As her condition progressed, the physical and mental demands of her role as a high school science teacher became increasingly difficult, and she nearly had no choice but to walk away from the job she loved.

"Employment support kept me working. If I can do this, hopefully it will help others."

MSWA Employment Support Consultant, Peta Flynn, worked closely with The Bunbury Senior High School team and Cathy to understand the daily demands of her role and remove any barriers in the classroom. Together, they made it possible to bring Tara on board as a support worker and education assistant - **an initiative the first of its kind** - giving Cathy the extra support she needed to keep teaching.

MSWA is working hard to expand our nursing support through a brand-new initiative - a program designed to provide **around-the-clock access to specialist nursing care** for people living with neurological conditions.

Nick's journey hasn't been easy. His daily care needs can be complex and overwhelming - from managing medications and appointments to the worry that something might go wrong when no one's around.

Everything changed when Nick was introduced to Aline, one of the nurses at MSWA, and says having her by his side has been "life changing."

However, this care isn't available 24/7.
